




Survey Methodology

r	Viethodology	 400 likely November 2024 voters in Oakland, CA Oversample of 50 in District 3 Interviews conducted by telephone (including cell phones and land lines), and online, with invitations sent by email or text, from voter file Conducted July 9 to July 11, 2024
	Margin of error	 The margin of error is ±4.9% for the full sample, ±9.5% for D3, and larger for subgroups Small samples of 100 or fewer are noted by *







Most say the overall quality of life in Oakland has become worse



The number of those saying quality of life is worse is high, but has decreased since 2023




Most name crime and public safety as a major issue facing Oakland

And what do you feel are the major issues facing Oakland today?




Concern about crime and public safety remains high but has declined from a peak last year












If there were an election to recall the Mayor of Oakland, would you vote to recall Mayor Sheng Thao or would you vote to keep Mayor Sheng Thao in office?








Half of D3 voters don't know if they would reelect or replace Carroll Fife, and others are closely divided

D3 Only: If the election were held today, would you vote to re-elect or replace District 3 City Council Member Carroll Fife? (n=107)






D5 Only: If the election were held today, would you vote to re-elect or replace District 5 City Council Member Noel Gallo? (n=45)





D7 voters are more likely to re-elect Treva Reid than replace her

D7 Only: If the election were held today, would you vote to reelect or replace District 7 City Council Member Treva Reid? (n=49)











If there were an election to recall the Alameda County District Attorney, would you vote to recall District Attorney Pamela Price or would you keep District Attorney Pamela Price in office?







Views on the City Attorney's office are more negative than positive, but many have no opinion

Oakland City Attorney's Office Approval








Voters are largely undecided in the city attorney vote





Strong majorities support proposals to address public safety, including job training








In Oakland, when businesses like restaurants, stores, and hotels close down, how much of a factor do you think crime is in causing them to close?










Overwhelming majority says it's important that Oakland encourage industrial, manufacturing, and logistics business

VOTE 1: How important, if at all, do you think it is that Oakland encourages industrial, manufacturing, and logistics businesses to remain in the city?







Arguments are less convincing to moderate, middle-age, and college grad voters


